Beaver family vault - Camperdown  
 Cemetery.

The abovementioned grave is situated in the western (uncleared) section of Camperdown Memorial Rest Park, formerly part of Camperdown Cemetery, Newtown. It is located immediately south of and about 3 yards from the well known "Wooley" grave enclosure. At the present time the Beaver vault contains no surface structures of any kind.

Mr. J.A. Beaver of Balgowlah, has recently written to this Department in regard to missing stonework, and has asked that the inscription stone from the vault be located and re-erected within the retained portion of the Cemetery.

The following is an extract from Mr. Beaver's letter of the 25th January, 1956:-

"With regard to the missing inscription stone, I wish to advise that some time ago, I made a personal inspection of the site of the Beaver Family Vault at Camperdown and, as you state in the above letter, there is no stone work visible on the site. However, a gentleman to whom I spoke to at the Cemetery and who appeared to know the place very well, said that workmen had placed the stonework in the Vault and covered the site with earth or sand etc.

If this statement is correct, it is rather disturbing as the inscription stone may be buried in the Vault site, and I would be grateful if you will assist me by making the necessary enquiries and advise me in due course."

Departmental records indicate that, in September, 1951, the Beaver vault (and several others in the vicinity) was broken into and damaged by vandals. It is understood that, at the time, the damaged vaults were filled in with sand and asphalt by the City Council in the interests of public health and safety.

In order that the matter may be given further consideration, I would be grateful if you would kindly furnish this Department with any other information known to you in relation to the Beaver vault - particularly as to the type and condition of the inscription stone in 1951 and whether it was, in fact, placed in the vault during filling operations.

It was understood by us the Easement was granted but as Mr Whitehead is not now acting for us, I am making sure of the application.

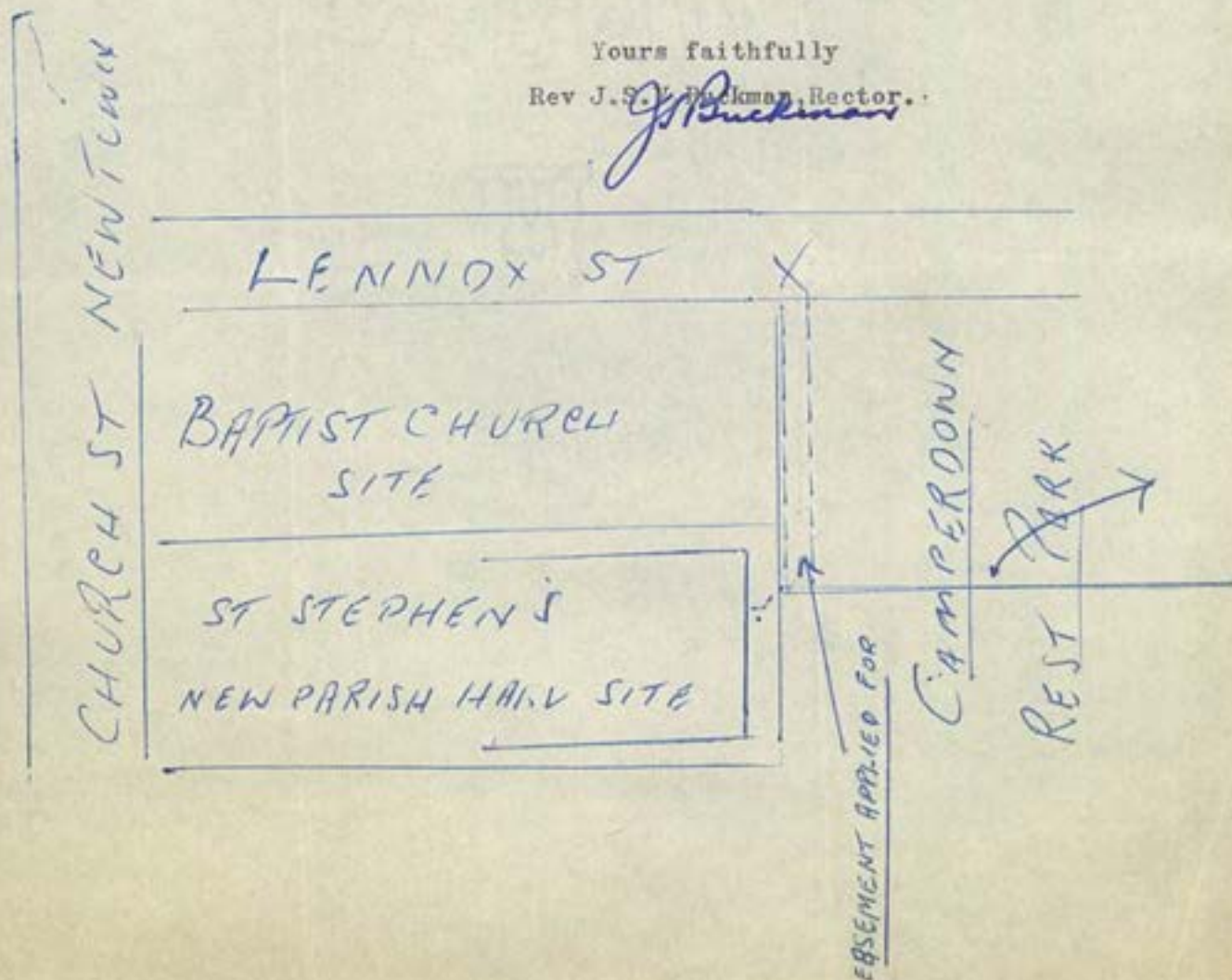
Bishop Hilliard and Mr Gledhill are both agreeable to the granting of the easement.
